Phonics

Phonics is the way the we teach children to read. Children are taught the sounds that can be combined to make up words. Children start learning sounds when they start Reception and they build up their knowledge as they progress through the school. Children are given reading books which match their phonics knowledge. The reading framework (a document produced by the Department for Education) is clear that children should not get books with sounds that they have not been taught.



We are holding a phonics talk for **Reception parents on Wednesday 1st November** between 9 and 10. This will take place in the hall and will include a chance to try some phonics activities with your children. We understand that not all parents will be able to attend and that parents in other year groups will find it useful and will be sharing a recording of the event afterwards.

This is our first open morning as part of our Working Together: Parent Partners initiative. We will have a number of different open mornings on different subjects as the year goes along with the aim of sharing what the children are learning: our wonderful curriculum and how you can support us at home.



I hope that you have a lovely restful half term and I look forward to seeing you back in school on Monday 30th October.


